

## Post-school destinations

- Only Victorian, Queensland and Western Australian data are available for 2009.
- The data may differ from school-specific exit data.

### Victoria

This data does not include international students.

The source of this post-school destination data is *On Track* survey data, collected from school leavers six months after they have left school. Data from most Victorian secondary schools have been included in the table. The remaining schools have not been included because the numbers of completing students, or the numbers of students responding to the post-school destination survey, were insufficient to provide reliable data.

Victorian students who gained but deferred taking up a university place are not included in this data. Transition rates to university and employment for Victorian schools should be interpreted in this context.

### Queensland

Incorporates all students including international, fee-paying, and visa students. Students from Queensland who were offered a university placement but deferred have been reported according to their engagement at the time of the survey.

### Western Australia

The source of the data is the *WA School Leaver Survey 2010*. Because it is survey data it may differ from school specific exit data. For statistical reliability, the data set includes only those schools with:

- more than ten (10) Year 12 students responding to the survey

and

- responding students representing more than 50% of the Year 12 student population.

Students from Western Australia who were offered a university placement but deferred have been reported according to their engagement at the time of the survey.
